Superyacht Centre

Port Denia is a unique solution for superyacht Owners, Captains, Crew and Guests.

The two international airports of Valencia and Alicante are both just a 1 hour drive away.

Our Marina is positioned just 50 metres from Denia town centre, can accommodate superyachts up to 130m LOA, 25m beam and 7m draft with 1000 amps of shore power available. Denia is

a beautiful, lively and cosmopolitan town, recently crowned a UNESCO Creative City for Gastronomy and an excellent centre for visiting the Costa Blanca as a whole or for visiting Ibiza and the Balearics, just 45 miles away. Denia has a 3 Michelin Star Restaurant, two nearby golf courses, 5* Hotels and a tennis club. A 25km stretch of Blue Flag beaches begin in Denia and the Port provides a range of watersports from jetski and boat rental, to kite surfing and windsurfing.

The Shipyard is located directly opposite the Marina, just 100m away.

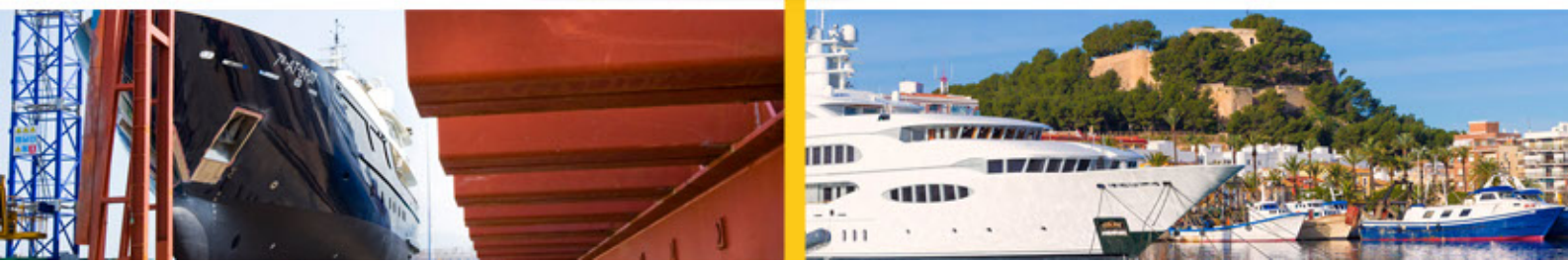

About Dénia

Dénia is a city in the province of Alicante, Spain, on the Costa Blanca halfway between Alicante and Valencia with a population of approximately 42,000, a figure that doubles in the summer. Once a quiet town at the centre of the region's raisin growing and fishing industries, Dénia is now a popular, international tourist destination. Significant recent investment has seen the Port flourish, with another 2 marinas (with smaller berths) offering restaurants, shops, tapas bars and discos to compliment the cosmopolitan city centre which is overlooked by the majestic 11th Century Dénia Castle. The charming historical town is well preserved and blends effortlessly into modern day citylife. Overlooking all proceedings is the Montgó Mountain, 753m tall it is a nature reserve offering breathtaking views and outdoor activities. The stretch of coastline just below is a designated marine reserve rich in ecosystems and wildlife, including dolphins, turtles and occasional whales. All sports and leisure activities are catered for, on land and water. Culture abounds with theatre and live music venues, including open air concerts throughout the summer. Dénia is famous for its celebration of Fallas in March, when neighbourhoods compete in the creation of gigantic sculptures (usually political satire) that are paraded and ultimately burnt in spectacular, Valencian fashion. Dénia is a city so rich in culture, incredibly diverse and fun, an ideal destination for everyone.



Costa Blanca & Valencia

The capital of the Region is Valencia, one of Spain's most important tourist destinations and the country's third largest city. Founded by the Romans in 138BC, there are many historical sites to visit which contrast nicely to the ultra modern City of Arts and Sciences which houses a world renowned aquarium, performance arts centre, science museum, art galleries, entertainment complexes etc. Beautiful beaches adorn Valencia and continue south along the coast, parallel to the extensive orange groves. Towns on the way include Cullera, Gandía and Oliva, all big tourist destinations. South of Dénia, there are numerous picture postcard destinations to visit including Jávea, Moraira, Calpe, Altea, Benidorm and Alicante. All have impressive marinas & coastlines, incredible restaurants and lifestyles worth tasting individually.

Visiting the Balearics

Dénia is so close to the turquoise waters and famous lifestyles of Formentera and Ibiza that a visit is a must. 45 miles away, Port Denia can assist with berths, otherwise there is a fast ferry service departing from Dénia every day, ideal for day trips or long weekends.
